

# Tohono O'Odham Legislative Council Resolution

**RESOLUTION OF THE TOHONO O'ODHAM LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL  
(Supporting the Proposed Pima County Historic Preservation Bond Projects 2004  
and the Conservation Bond Program Proposal for 2004)**

**WHEREAS:** the Tohono O'odham Nation passed an Archaeological Resources Protection Ordinance (06-84) for the protection and preservation of cultural resources historically associated with traditional or sacred values and beliefs important to the O'odham and of the physical site, location or context in which cultural resources are found, and

**WHEREAS:** the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the importance and need to protect, preserve and manage cultural and natural resources on the Nation's lands and on traditional-use lands located in Pima County, and

**WHEREAS:** the Tohono O'odham Nation recognizes the efforts of Pima County Government and its Historic Preservation Office to protect, preserve and manage cultural and natural resources on O'odham traditional-use lands in Pima County, and

**WHEREAS:** the proposed Pima County Historic Preservation Bond Projects for 2004 will provide funds for the protection and preservation of O'odham ancestral Hohokam sites such as the Los Morteros site, the Valencia Road site, the Marana Mound Community, the Sabino Canyon site and the Coyote Mountains sites, and

**WHEREAS:** the proposed Pima County Conservation Bond Program for 2004 will protect, preserve and manage important natural resource areas in Pima County that provide context for significant cultural resource sites.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Tohono O'odham Nation strongly supports the efforts of Pima County Government to preserve, protect and manage significant cultural and natural resources through its proposed Historic Preservation Bond Projects and Conservation Bond Program for 2004 and urges voters in Pima County to support these bond project proposals.
